
Activity 1: Acquiring Background Knowledge on Youngstownske' Slovenske' Noviny and Jedność Polek

- Have students count off up to 2. 1s will be assigned to *Youngstownske' Slovenske' Noviny* ("Youngstown Slovak News") and 2s will be assigned to *Jedność Polek* ("Unity of Polish Women"). They will be reading linked articles about each of these immigrant newspapers to acquire background information.
- Pass out the handout that goes with this activity and explain to the class that they must first fill out the answers to their assigned newspaper.
- After they are finished with their answers for their assigned newspaper, students will find a student who was assigned the other newspaper. They will verbally share their answers and write down the answers for the other newspaper.

Activity 2: Analyzing How Ohio's Immigrant Press Covered the 1920s KKK

- Inform students that they will be finding and analyzing two articles from each of these newspapers that cover the Klan in some capacity.
- Next, pass out the chart that goes along with this activity.
- Direct students to Chronicling America and demonstrate to them how to access PDF versions of the pages, copy the text, and use an online translation tool like Google Translate to decipher these articles written in foreign languages.
- If some groups finish early, have them share their findings. This may turn into homework.
