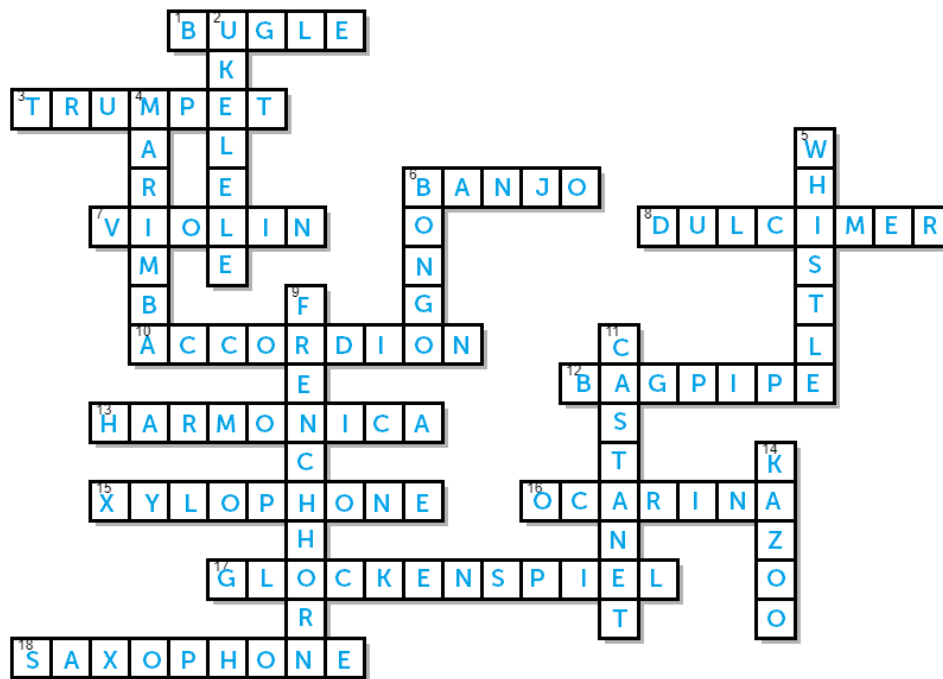


## Instruments – Answers
