### Stark County Democrat

The *Stark County Democrat* was established in 1833 using equipment acquired from a failed newspaper in Paris, Ohio. A man named Leonard purchased the printing equipment and supplies and founded the *Democrat* in nearby Canton. Within six months, Leonard died of cholera, and ownership of the paper was transferred to the

controversial McKinley tariff of 1890 that caused him to lose his seat in Congress, but its reports did indicate that McKinley was, overall, well-liked by his fellow Cantonians and considered to be a man with "no stain" on his character.

Beginning in 1888, the *Democrat* benefitted from the steady guidance of Civil War General and former Ohio Secretary of State and Representative Isaac R. Sherwood, who owned the Democratic Publishing Company. By that point, the paper was operating a cylinder press (established in 1866, the first in Stark County) and had cultivated a circulation of over 7,500. After General Sherwood retired, the *Democrat* changed hands several more times before it finally ceased publication in 1912.

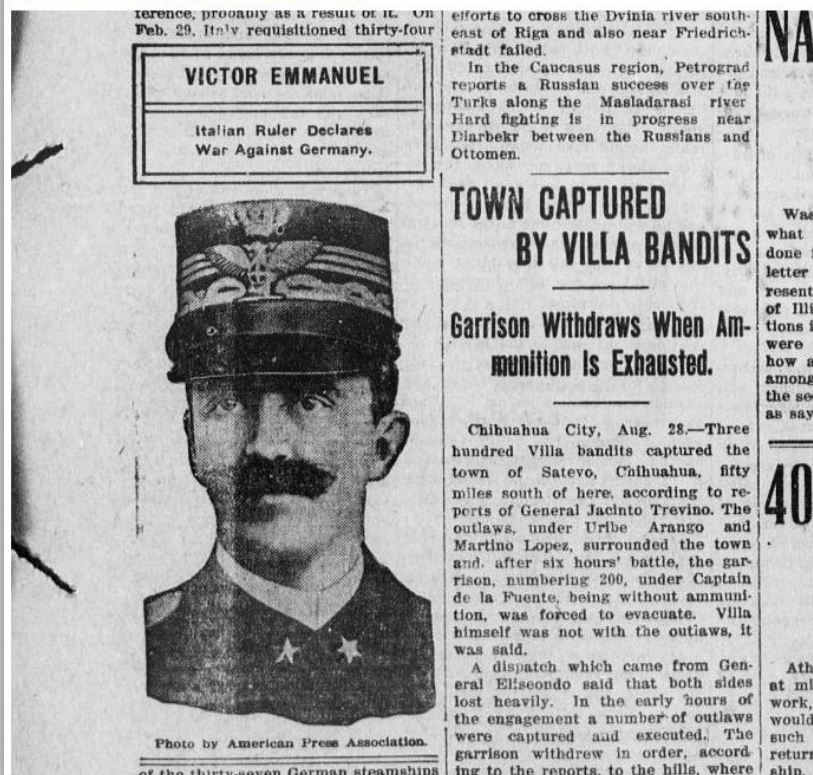


The Democratic banner. (Mt. Vernon, Ohio) 1898-192?, August 29, 1916, Image 1

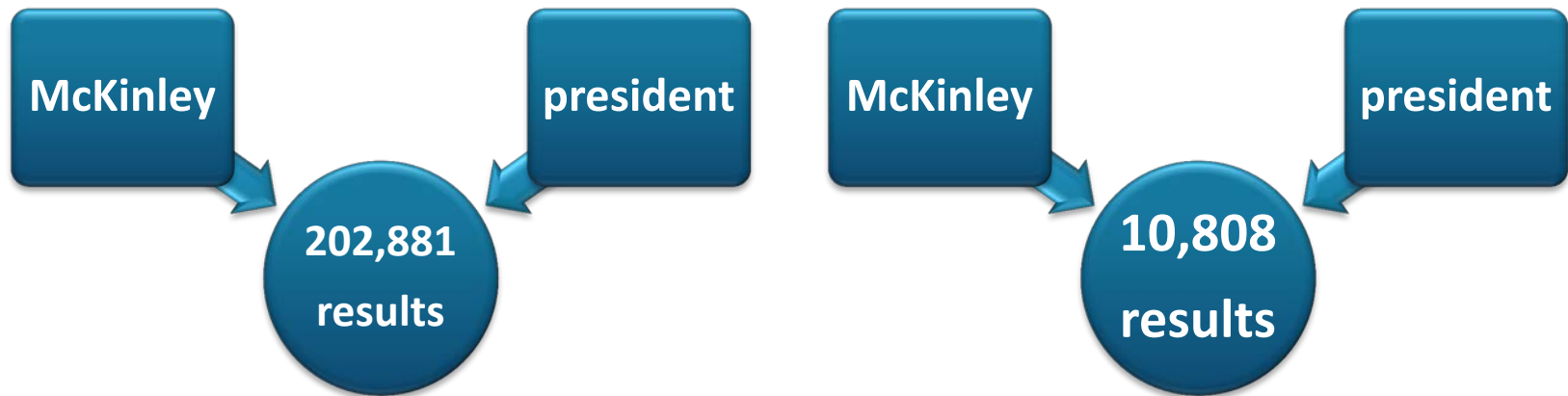

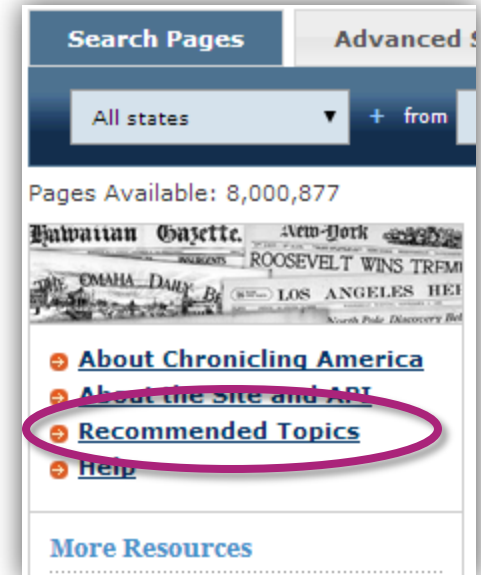

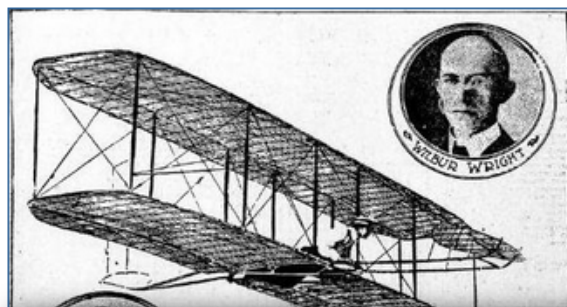

### Important Dates:

- December 17, 1903. Wright brothers achieve the first piloted, sustained flight of a heavier-than-air machine at Kitty Hawk, North Carolina.
- January 5, 1904. Wright brothers make an announcement to the Associated Press about the success of their flights.
- 1904-1905. Wilbur and Orville continue their experiments and make improvements to their airplane.
- May 22, 1906. U.S. Patent Office issues patent 821,393 to the Wright Brothers for their flying machine.



### Suggested Search Strategies:

- [Try the following terms in combination, proximity, or as phrases using [Search Pages](#) in Chronicling America.] Since the term "airplane" was not yet in common use, try using other terms from the time. Try searching with any of the words flight, flying, airship, aeroplane or aeronaut.
- Try using a specific date range to find articles about a particular event.
- Since Wilbur and Orville were not always mentioned by first name, you can search with any of the words Wilbur or Orville and then search with Wright and brothers within 10 words of each other.

# Historical Newspapers

- Often partisan, with specific political agendas
- Multiple papers in each town, county or region
- More graphics and prominent headlines in 20<sup>th</sup> century
- More family history information



# Special Newspapers

- Focused on news of particular groups or organizations

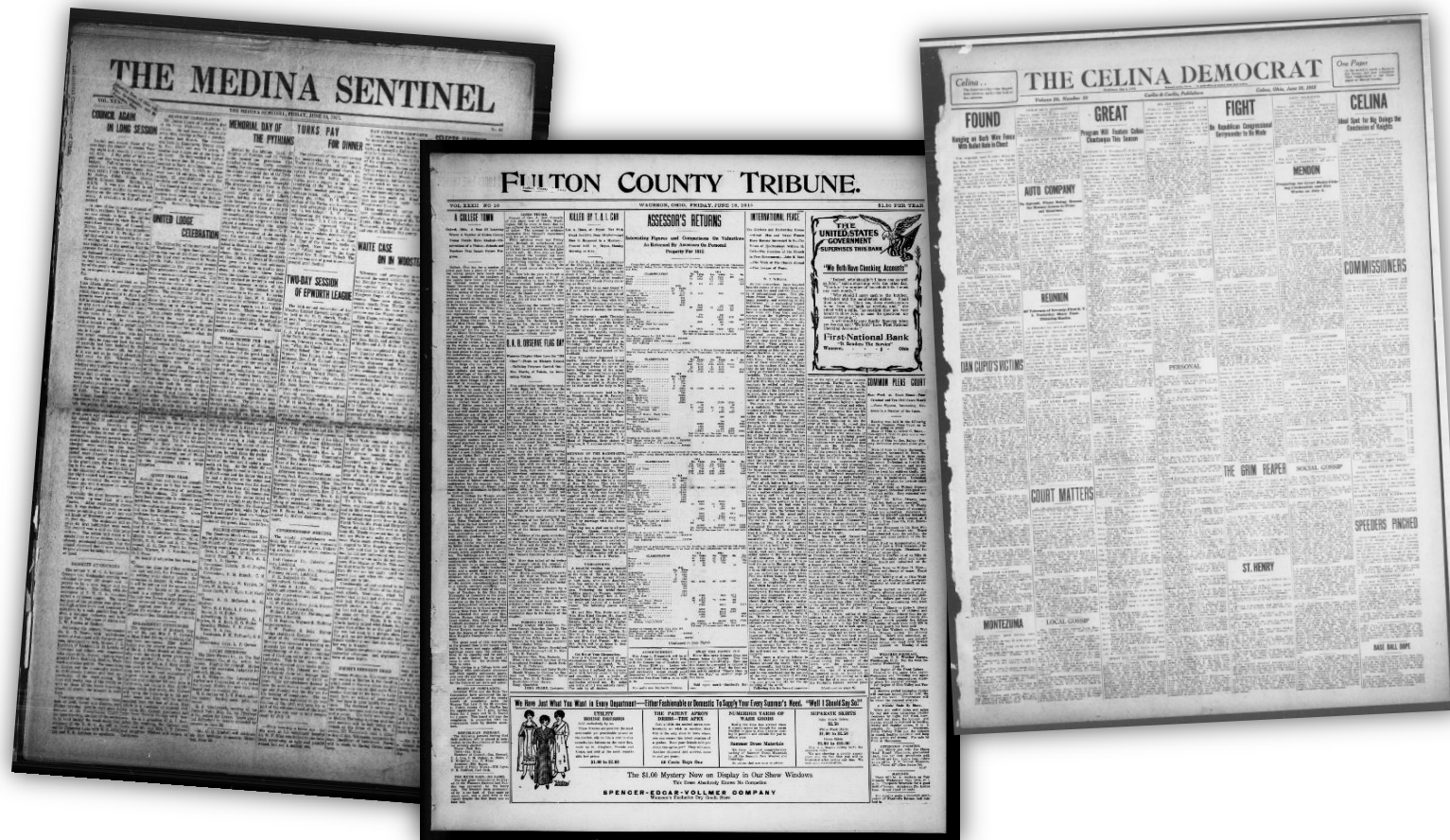




# Even More Search Tips

- **Use state and date limiters**
- **Use limits in combination to achieve more precise searching**
- **Use many words to characterize the topic**
- **Too many results?**
  - Use more specific terms
  - Use limits in combination
- **Too few results?**
  - Use alternate terms and broader subjects
  - Relax limits

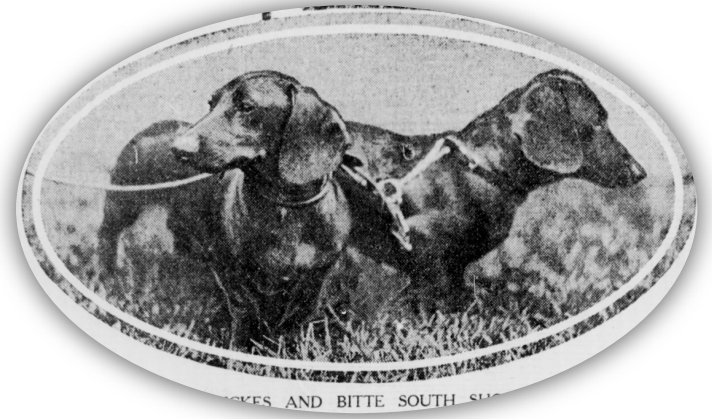
